# MILTON FILM FESTIVAL SHORT FILM SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

## **MISSION & OBJECTIVE**

The Milton Film Festival was founded to promote local film makers and enrich the cultural lives of those living in and around Milton by exhibiting local, Canadian and international films not generally available in the area.

### ABOUT THE FESTIVAL

The second annual Milton Film Festival will run from January 27th-29th, 2017 at the Milton Centre for the Arts in Milton, Ontario. Filmmakers from Milton, Halton, and the GTHA are invited to submit short films under 20 minutes in length for exhibition in our Short Film Programme.

Exhibiting these films at the Milton Film Festival provide opportunities for the general public to see a variety of films which may not receive mass distribution, and for independent filmmakers to reach new audiences and explore new opportunities for distribution.

The Milton Film Festival is looking for films that are creatively compelling and technically excellent. Filmmakers who are accepted and attend the festival will be invited to represent their films in Q&A sessions with the Film Festival audiences.

Non-cash recognition will be acknowledged at the end of the festival for the best short film in the professional, amateur, and student categories, to be judged by audience members and an independent committee.

# **GENERAL RULES**

We have a finite number of films that we can fit into a weekend. Like most film festivals, there is a selection process. Submissions will be selected based on the following criteria:

- Your submission has to actually be a film. It has to tell a story or make a point or seek to inform the audience.
- Your submission has to be ready for a festival. The cinematography, lighting, editing and direction have to reflect a level of skill and effort consistent with the competitive spirit of a festival environment.
- It has to be compelling. It needs to hold the viewers' attention so that they feel they have enough invested in it to see it through to the finish.
- It must be in digital format either DVD, Blu-ray, or HD digital file. If you are unsure, please contact us.

#### SUBMITTING YOUR FILM

*The deadline for submission is October 30th, 2016*. If your film is selected, you will be notified by December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016.
